



They actively think about how they can add value to people. They look for opportunities to add value to others and then they do things that add value to people."

Maxell also spoke about trust. "To build trust, a leader must exhibit competence, connection, and character." In The 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership, Maxwell says trust is the most crucial aspect of leadership. It is the foundation which all relationships are built upon.
